# NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON TAX INCREASE

A tax rate of \$0.497242 per \$100 valuation has been proposed by the governing body of Hill County.

PROPOSED TAX RATE \$0.497242 per \$100  
NO-NEW-REVENUE TAX RATE \$0.494056 per \$100  
VOTER-APPROVAL TAX RATE \$0.520298 per \$100

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2021 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for Hill County from the same properties in both the 2020 tax year and the 2021 tax year.

The voter-approval rate is the highest tax rate that Hill County may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate.

The proposed tax rate is greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that Hill County is proposing to increase property taxes for the 2021 tax year.

A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE WILL BE HELD ON September 7, 2021 at 8:30 AM at Hill County Commissioner's Court, 80 N. Waco St., Hillsboro, TX 776645.

The proposed tax rate is not greater than the voter-approval tax rate. As a result, Hill County is not required to hold an election at which voters may accept or reject the proposed tax rate. However, you may express your support for or opposition to the proposed tax rate by contacting the members of the Hill County of Hill County at their offices or by attending the public hearing mentioned above.

The 86th Legislature modified the manner in which the voter-approval tax rate is calculated to limit the rate of growth of property taxes in the state.

The following table compares the taxes imposed on the average residence homestead by Hill County last year to the taxes proposed to be imposed on the average residence homestead by Hill County this year.
